1. PROJECT OVERVIEW

Two hundred and thirty beneficiaries of government housing schemes - Sardar Awas Yojana (SAY) and Indira Awas Yojana (IAY) approached Habitat for Humanity's partner ANaRDe Foundation for financial support to build new houses. Through these government schemes — SAY or IAY, each beneficiary received a grant of Rs. 45,000. However, this amount was not sufficient to complete the houses. H N Safal Group bridged this gap through a generous donation and 230 families were able to construct their own homes and gain access to safe and decent shelter.





An inauguration ceremony of the project attended by Mr. H N Vora of H N Safal Group, partner organizations and community members.

1.1 OBJECTIVES

The project "Decent and Affordable Homes for 230 low income families in Gujarat" supported by H N Safal Group from January - December, 2011 had the following objectives:


- 1) To support 230 low income families of Gujarat to live in better and affordable homes by constructing new houses.
- 2) To promote appropriate local construction technology and housing solutions among these families.





1.2 SCOPE

The project spanned five districts of Gujarat including Amreali, Himmatnagar, Dharampur (Valsad), Mehsana and Anand. Two hundred and thirty families comprising 1150 individuals have benefitted from the project.

An overview of each selected district:

Anand

In Anand Gujarat, a village is characterized by rows of houses, each row is inhabited by a particular community. Local communities like Thakarda, Patidar, Wankar, Bhangi, Suthar and Chambadia occupy rows of blocks in strips. The houses of Bhangis, the sweepers, and Chambadia, a scheduled caste are isolated on the fringes of a village. Houses with mud walls and tiled and thatched roofs belong to the poorer sections of the population like Bharwads, the cattle-breeders. Sometimes a house is occupied by several families, in which case the rooms or blocks are allocated to individual families.

Mehasana

The villages in Mehasana, north Gujarat are based in a semi-arid region. Communal segregation is common in the village and groups of houses belonging to Patidars, Prajapatis and Thakardas are found here. If Harijans, are in the village, they find a place in one corner, detached from the main settlement. The houses are built in rows with common outer walls. These are made of stone, brick or mud and could have a flat roof or a sloping roof covered with tiles. In some cases, the roof could be even a thatched canopy on a circular hut. These three types represent the three economic classes in a village. The houses have generally poor ventilation, low roofs and appear more like temporary shelters.

Himmatnagar

The village in the northern part of Himmatnagar is an aggregation of groups of huts, often arranged around a tank and separated by groves of acacia. Each cluster of houses in a village is called a 'Vandh' and represents a closely related homogeneous group. The roof is a thatched cone supported by a clay or dry-brick wall. The houses have no partition inside and are ventilated by two or three small windows. There is no wood work, no door frame or door to the house. The majority of the total rural houses in Kutch are built of stone.





Chanch, Amreli

In south Gujarat, a village is a cluster of houses with no definite plan. The house frontages are not in a straight line and their facades have no uniformity. The village is arbitrarily divided into 'mohollas'. The roofs of houses are invariably sloping and are tiled, thatched, or covered with iron sheets. Wood is used as a building material and elaborate carving on the threshold is a common feature of houses belonging to the head of the village or a prosperous farmer.

Dharampur

Around 60 % of the population of Dharampur belong to Scheduled Tribes, Scheduled Castes and Other Backward Classes. These communities live in extreme poverty and are economically and socially disadvantaged. They have high levels of illiteracy and lack access to assets, financial resources, healthcare and social services. They live in temporary houses with mud floors, no stone foundations, walls with reeds or mud and roofs thatched with grass. Few employment opportunities and low levels of education and skill result in low cash incomes. This in turn affects the ability to purchase basic necessities such as medicines, education for children, etc.





1.3 METHODOLOGY

1.3.1 Beneficiary Selection Criteria

- Non-Discrimination: Families belonging to any race, tribe, and political or religious preference were invited to apply.
- Housing Application: The Family Selection Committee administered a uniform application to all communities in the project area.
- Screening Process: The administrator verified documents and certified that the information given in the application was true. Based on the verification report the applicant's eligibility for a Habitat house was screened.
- Sardar Awas Yojana/Indira Awas Yojana: The family had to be a beneficiary of the housing scheme for the current year.





1.3.2 Baseline Survey

A baseline survey was conducted to capture demographic and socio-economic data of each project area. This data generated indicators that were used to evaluate the project's impact. Families were grouped into clusters and provided with training in managing related finances, construction of houses, procurement of building material, use of locally available appropriate construction materials, self-house design, importance of *shramdam*, creating a construction schedule and self-monitoring.





1.3.3 Eligible Beneficiaries

Certain criteria was used to determine the eligibility of a beneficiary, this included:

- Current living conditions and need of alternative shelter.
- Marginalisation and impoverishment (annual family income of Rs. 6000 -10000).
- Legal land ownership.
- Willingness to provide 'sweat equity' shramdan.
- Willingness to repay the interest-free loan.
- Families that had not defaulted on any other debts.
- Priority was given to women headed families / physically challenged families.

1.4 PROJECT ACTIVITIES

Project activities that were carried out in partnership with ANaRDe Foundation included:

- a. Selection and orientation of beneficiaries.
- b. Documentation of family details, socio-economic profile, photographs of houses selected before and after construction.
- c. Construction of 230 houses.
- d. Collection of monthly loan repayment installments from the NGO partner.
- f. Submitting reports (program and financial) monthly/quarterly/six monthly/annual to HFH India and respective Donors





2.0 PROJECTIMPACT

2.1 AN OVERVIEW

About 1,150 people directly benefitted from the project. These families had no other sources of finance and were in need of urgent financial support to complete their new houses. Better and improved houses resulted in numerous tangible and intangible benefits for these rural families including:

- With a secure home women and children of 230 families will now be protected from exploitation and abuse and vagaries of nature.
- Improved levels of self esteem on account of ownership of an asset
- Improved health status of 230 families
- Children of 230 families will now have an enabling environment to do their homework, be able to study better and be motivated to attend school regularly.
- Earning members of 230 families will now be able to concentrate on work knowing that their families are safe and secure. Housing enables women to seek livelihood options, knowing that their families are safe and secure.
- These families now have more income available for education, health and savings as result of reduction in cost of repairs/maintenance and time available for livelihood options
- Creation of higher value assets for the families.





2.2 VOICES OF BENEFICIARIES: New Homes and Changes in the lives of Beneficiaries


Mrs. Shardaben Ravjibhai Thakor (Gorel)

A few days ago, I had a dream that we were shifting to 'pucca houses' from our old hut. To my surprise, our names appeared as selected beneficiaries of 'Sardar Awas Yojna'. Despite being selected as beneficiaries, we were afraid to avail of this scheme given that we did not have sufficient finances to open a bank account, as mandated by the scheme. To our good fortune, an ANaRDe representative helped us to get an interest free loan of Rs. 15,000 from Habitat for Humanity and H N Safal. With this amount we opened a bank account, started construction

work and built a house of our own choice and design with a sanitation facility. This new home

has helped us to start our new life.







Mrs. Gangaben Jagabhai Thakor (Gorel)

With the interest free loan given by H N Safal and Habitat for Humanity in collaboration with local partner ANaRDe, we were able to reconstruct my old house and build a wonderful new home. Earlier, I struggled to get my son married because of the dilapidated condition of our home. However, now many families have approached us with marriage proposals for my son and I no longer have to worry about his future. This new home has given us all a better future.









Mr. Jitubhai Dahyabhai Thakor – (Gorel)

For years we lived with the fear of our house collapsing on us as we slept. It was thatched with tin and plastic and the walls were made of mud. The house had no proper foundation so there was always the danger of it collapsing in the monsoon. Each year I used to feel helpless because my elderly mother and three young children had to sleep on a wet floor during the monsoon season. On my meager income, I couldn't afford to repair the roof and fortify my house. To my good luck, my name appeared as a beneficiary on Sardar Awas Yojana list. Unfortunately, I could not avail this benefit because of financial constraints. Then an ANaRDe representative helped my family to get an interest free loan of rupees 15,000 from H N Safal and Habitat for Humanity. With this amount we opened a bank account and built a safe, dry and secure home. Now my old mother and three children sleep peacefully at night.





Shardaben Rameshbhai

"

My husband and I are casual labourers and were staying in a rented house in our village. The Government allotted plots for 50 families to build houses outside the village. I was among those selected but did not have sufficient money to construct my house. Then an ANaRDe representative helped us to get interest free loan of rupees 10,000 from H N Safal and Habitat for Humanity. If it wasn't for this loan, I would never have been able to avail the scheme, given that my daily wages are inadequate. I now have a home to call my own, something I earlier wouldn't have even dared to dream off.







2.3 RESULTS

Objective 1

To Support 230 low income families of Gujarat to live in better and affordable homes by constructing new houses.

Results

- 230 Families received interest free soft loans for housing and constructed new house.
- Children, elderly and sick members of these families are now living in clean and secure homes.







Objective 2

To promote appropriate local construction technology and housing solutions among 230 low income families of Gujarat.

Results

- Locally available construction material was utilized in building new homes.
- Local construction technologies and skills were applied for the same.
- Local masons and unskilled labourers were employed in these builds.


